### Contracts and dispute resolution

**Academic year 2010/2011**

For 20 years the **International Training Centre of the ILO** and a number of academic partners led by the **University of Turin** and the **University Institute of European Studies**, in collaboration with other world-class universities have been offering a shortened version of this programme under the name "International Trade Law Post-Graduate Course".

In recognition of increasing demand for higher levels of specialization in the fields of contract law and international trade, it was decided to expand and upgrade the programme's learning contents to an LL.M. Course.

The LLM programme is an intensive course of one full year, composed of three parts: Part I (distance learning), Part II (face-to-face) and Part III (submission of the research paper)

The main objective of the LLM programme is providing fundamental tools and competencies needed to deal with the complex reality of international commercial transactions from a European and an international perspective and in particular with respect to: **Contracts' Drafting, Interpretation and Management of International Commercial Contracts, International Dispute Resolution, Arbitration and Moot Court.**
